1. Report Purpose

1.1. Note the Audit Scotland Report on Children and Young People's Mental Health in the context of recent consideration by regional Audit Committee Chairs of college approaches to supporting good mental health and wellbeing.

3. Audit Scotland Report on Children and Young People's Mental Health

- 2.2 In September 2017, Audit Scotland published a review of Children and Young People's Mental Health. - **2.3** The report highlights the increasing pressure being placed on often fragmented mental health services for children and young people, and recommends a step change in the availability of services, with a stronger focus and resource base for early intervention approaches.
- **2.4** The report notes that all public services have an important role to play in supporting wellbeing and tackling the social and economic factors that contribute to mental health problems, including education.

4. Risk Analysis

4.1. No immediate risks are identified. Discussions are underway at executive level to share knowledge and develop a collective, regional position with regards mental health and well-being, and a report will be provided to the Board on this matter in due course.

5. Equalities Implications

5.1. The report highlights the need to improve models of service delivery for children and young people with learning disabilities.
