1. Report Purpose

1.1 This report provides the Committee with an update on Assigned College progress with the annual cycle of evaluation/development reporting.

3. Background

3.1 The Code of Good Governance requires (item D.23) that:

The board must keep its effectiveness under annual review and have in place a robust self-evaluation process. There should also be an externally facilitated evaluation of its effectiveness at least every three years. The board must send its self-evaluation (including an externally facilitated evaluation) and board development plan (including progress on previous year's plan) to its funding body and publish them online.

- **3.2** Assigned College Board Secretaries were contacted in April 2019 to request relevant the reports. At that stage, detailed reports for 2018-19 were not yet available, but some interim reports were provided which demonstrated that the colleges had compliant arrangements in place.
- 3.3 Self-evaluation reports have now been considered by the City of Glasgow College and Glasgow Kelvin College Boards and are provided for Members' information. Clyde College Board considered a proposal for self-evaluation at its June meeting; a report will be shared with the Committee in due course.
