1. Report Purpose

1.1. To update the board on the current position with the SFC Review of Coherent Provision and Sustainability, the SFC Review of Regional Strategic Bodies and to consider GCRB's options for further strategic engagement and planning.

2. Recommendations

- **2.1.** That the board **note** the content of Scottish Funding Council's first-phase report into the findings of the *SFC Review of Coherent Provision and Sustainability (annex A);*
- **2.2.** That the board **note** the content of the Scottish Funding Council's *Review of Regional Strategic Bodies* Glasgow Region report (annex B);
- **2.3.** That the board **agree** to hold a single-item additional board meeting on Monday 9 November 2020 to more fully consider and plan based on the reviews.

3. Report

- **3.1.** Scottish Funding Council initiated a review of Scotland's three Regional Strategic Bodies in 2019, seeking to assess GCRB's effectiveness in meetings its core statutory duties and wider aims of regionalisation. Publication of the reviews was held back until autumn 2020 as the aims of the review became interlinked with report into the broader Scotland-wide tertiary education systems.
- **3.2.** As confirmed to board on Monday 15 June 2020, the Minister for Further and Higher Education provided an update on 4 June 2020 in his letter to Mike Cantlay, Chair of the Scottish Funding Council, *entitled SFC Review of Coherent Provision and Sustainability*.
- **3.3.** In this letter, the Minister focused on the 'recovery' and 'renewal' stages of the Covid-19 response, emphasising the role of the education sector in contributing to 'the regrowth and renewal of Scotland's prosperity'. This letter was a significant indicator of the requirement for sectoral change, with the Minister stating: "It is clear to us all that existing models of funding, governance, collaboration and delivery will need to shift in order to meet new challenges and exploit new opportunities."

- **3.4.** The Minister charged the Scottish Funding Council with leading this process of "securing coherent provision by post-16 education bodies, and the undertaking of research in these changing times. We expect this will cover future provision, delivery, outcomes and targets, funding models and support for research activity across the college and university sector in Scotland."
- **3.5.** The review was directed to cover the following:
 - consider how best to achieve coherence in the further and higher education sectors;
 - sector should be fit for purpose to address the outcomes;
 - the changes needed to existing funding, operations, and accountability frameworks in order to respond effectively to these new challenges and opportunities; and
 - to provide advice, where appropriate, to Scottish Ministers on relevant changes to policy, funding and accountability frameworks for tertiary education and research in Scotland.
- **3.6.** Given the significant implications to the sector and region, GCRB continues to engage with, and support, the review, and maintain our offer of additional support to both Scottish Government and Scottish Funding Council. Since the previous board meeting, GCRB, via its Executive Director, has a seat on one of the advisory groups working directly with SFC on the report representing Regional Strategic Bodies. In addition, the Executive Director continues to meet regularly with SFC colleagues and attend the Colleges Scotland College Principals' Group where the review is regularly discussed and updates provided.
- **3.7.** We are now able to present to board the *Review of Regional Strategic Bodies* report into the Glasgow region, as well as the phase-one findings of the review.

3.8. Review of Regional Strategic Bodies

- **3.9.** The review provides a historical background narrative on the creation and development of the Glasgow RSB, an overview of the progress made, and provides a significantly positive endorsement of the activity of the RSB in delivering its role.
- **3.10.** The report provides core 'improvement actions' for consideration of the board, and it is recommended that these recommendations as well as the recommendations of the broader sector review provide the framework for GCRB board activity and development of strategic direction.

3.11. SFC Review of Coherent Provision and Sustainability

- **3.12.** The key recommendations and findings of the RSB Review are brought forward into the broader sector-wide review to provide specific recommendations and key prompts for direction of travel in the Glasgow region.
- **3.13.** As above, it is recommended that the content of this review, in association with the content of the RSB Review provide the framework for activity as GCRB develops strategy for 2021 onwards.
