1. Executive Summary

3. Background

- **3.1** The Scheme of Delegated Authority requires the Executive Director to report to the regular meetings of the Board any decisions he has made under the Scheme of Delegated Authority for amounts greater than £10,000 in relation to:
 - Committing funds within agreed budgets;
 - Revision of individual budgets for any one year up to a limit of £10,000 or 5%, whichever is the higher; and
 - Application of any discretionary budget controlled by the Executive Director.

In addition, delegated authority may be used to exercise decisions via the Scheme of Delegation, and these are reported to board in the separate paper *Decisions via Scheme of Delegation*.

4. Report

4.1 During the reporting period there has been no use of delegated authority which requires to be noted within above guidelines.

5. Risk and Compliance Analysis

5.1 The Executive Director is responsible for implementation of the Glasgow Region strategic plan, management of risk and oversight of resources. The use of delegated authority is designed to maintain these positions.
